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








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

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Prototype Shows Marque's Presence in Road Racing

orsche unveiled photos of its new LMP1 Prototype in early June, announcing that it had begun on-track testing at its Weissach Motorsports Center several weeks ahead of schedule. The new racer will contest the WEC Championship and LeMans next year. Factory driver Timo Bernhard has been deeply involved in the car's development, and pronounced himself pleased with early testing. Although the car was disguised in a strange black and white psychedelical livery—a vinyl wrap, no doubt—that hid many of its surface features, it appears in photographs to be similar in nature to the Audi and Peugeot WEC and LM cars, with a narrow closed cockpit and a long dorsal stabilizing fin extending from the top of the cockpit roof back to the large rear wing—not particularly attractive to this writer's eyes, but if it works ... No rear views of the car were offered in the initial news release on June 12. That could suggest that the rear of the car includes some new features that Porsche would prefer not to reveal at this point ... or it could also mean that Porsche didn't think it was important enough to illustrate. What is important to us as supporters of the marque is that Porsche is finally back in the Big Leagues of international road racing, and that's worthy of celebrating.



STILL PLAYS WITH CARS, CONTINUED



We have all become accustomed to filling our cars and tracks—the non-Diesel variety, at least—with gasoline polluted with 10% Ethanol, and while it might help reduce exhaust emissions on a gallon-for-gallon basis, I've become convinced that the entire Ethanol program is merely a sop to the Corn Lobby, and its powerful supporters in Congress. Ethanol may indeed be helpful in reducing harm to the air we breathe, but since it also produces less energy per gallon, meaning that we need to consume more if it to get us from Point A to Point B. That means more profit to corn farmers, and it also means more dollars out of our pockets. When you add in the harm that alcohol does to the fuel systems of older automobiles, it's not such a great idea. Now we learn that the EPA, having already approved the use of E15—15% Ethanol and 85% gasoline—is thinking about doubling that figure to 30% Ethanol. While new cars can be engineered to run properly on the higher level of alcohol, older cars cannot. If you think the 30% proposal is a terrible idea, as I do, this is the time to write a letter to your Congressperson and Senators and tell them so.


An interesting little news item popped up in May, courtesy of OSPIRG, the Oregon Student Public Interest Research Group. It states flatly that "The Driving Boom—a six decade-long period of steady increases in per-capita driving in the United States—is over." Although its news release did not cite any specific studies or sources, OSPIRG claims that we drive fewer total miles today than we did eight years ago, and fewer per person than at the end of President Clinton's first term. It points to the end of conditions that led to the driving boom, including cheap gas and expansion of the baby Boomer workforce. Today's Millenial generation no longer sees driving as a need, turning instead to greater use of public transportation, says OSPIRG, which calls for development of a new transportation policy that reflects these changes.

The remainder of our Saturday found more great twisty roads and outstanding sights, including Multnomah Falls, which we got a long look at due to very slow moving traffic through their parking area.



he fifth autocross of ORPCA's season is now in the books, happening on July 14. Seventy-five drivers, including a record 48 drivers in the Non-Porsche Street Tire class, took to the special course—dubbed "Head's Up"— for a day of fun and challenge.

Oh, what a challenge it was! The course proved be tricky, and many DNFs resulted in the first few runs, but every driver got six shots at it—and everyone had it figured out by the end, with at least one clean run. It was a longer course, hovering over one minute for most drivers (at which point severe fatigue sets in and you can optionally stop and have a corner worker bring refreshments to your window).

On to the action! The absolutely massive field of street-tire-equipped non-Porsches featured just about everything, including an ex-drag racing Pontiac Trans Am, the cleanest 1981 280ZX outside of a museum, a Nissan Leaf electric car, a Lotus Elise, and the usual suspects of various BMWs, Miatas, and Subarus. The top person in class was Jeffery Fields in a 2005 Mazdaspeed Miata with a scorching 55.437, with a scorching Tim Hill behind in an 07 BMW Z4M with a 55.888, and the last podium-finisher, Hayward Tyler, in a 2005 Subaru WRX STi with a 55.990. It was quite a drop off to fourth, Charles Dodds with a 57.928 in his 2001 Miata, who moves into second place in the overall points hunt (23) to Sammy Lin (33).

NP-R had a healthy showing with five drivers, and for once they were skunked out by the street tire gang in the dry! Stephan Ryabinin took the victory with a shortened 56.221. His LS1-swapped 240Z suffered some fuel leaking issues, so he pulled out before his six runs were done. Stephan is now tied for third with 18 points, with Rudy Avalon (fifth this event). Phong Chau took his gloriously yellow Lexus IS300 to second with a 58.129. Phong is now tied for first (21 points) with Mark Koerbel.

S02 had three drivers take the start, with Jim Pileggi the victor with a 56.539 in his '05 Boxster S over Gary Johnson ('07 Cayman S, 59.523) and Sean Vanderheiden ('03 996 Carrera 2, 61.242). Jim holds the slightest of leads (40) over Sean (39) and Sean (26). (Continued on next page)

S01 got positively crowded, with seven drivers competing! Chuck Jarvie earned the victory with a 60.286 in his '04 Boxster S, and Bryce Bederka nabbed second with a 60.943 in his '99 Boxster. Chuck moves into the points lead (38) over Rod Street (30) and Bryce Bederka (23) leapfrogs Bryan Brock (21) and Don Dexter (20).

Donald Prier took advantage of Barry Cogut's absence to take the solo victory in P04. Barry has 21 points on the season and Don now has seven, he has a chance to make the deficit over the next three rounds.

Bob Schatz and Jeff Gretz had an absolute slugfest in P03! They were



right behind each other in line and were literally trading the lead back and forth with each run. Jeff was oddly attracted to the cones though, so Bob held on for an amazing victory. Jeff holds on to the points lead with 35 over Bob's 26.

In P02, Jedi Master Eric Freedle took the victory again, with a blistering 56.933 in his '86 Carrera over newcomer Dave Schwartz in his beautiful red '85 Targa. Jedi Eric increases his points lead to 37 over absent Jim Park's 23.

P01 also got crowded all of a sudden, with four drivers taking the start. Steve Getsiv is working the bugs out of his freshly-restored 914, and laid an absolute stunner of a last run with a 58.248 in his '73 914 for the victory. Steve was in third when he laid down that last-chance time. Ryan Davis is getting more comfortable with his '84 944 and nabbed second with a 58.684. Harry Danberg had been in a fight for the lead in his '73 Targa, but wound up third this day. Harry retains the points lead (41), and absent Cary Kutter keeps second (30), with Steve and Ryan closing fast. This will be a good one all the way until the last run!

In I01, your author took the victory again over Todd Averitt, both in Todd's amazing '71 914. (He didn't even find the nitrous tank!) Autocross Chair Todd says the Improved class is like "Who's Line Is It Anyway?" where the points don't matter.

Finally, in M01 we had the return of a past champion with Douglass Skinner and "Kermie," his Viper Green '73 Carrera powered by the 3.6L 993 engine. They did not disappoint and absolutely ran away with TTOD with a 53.048!

So the Porsches have been dominating the Top Time slot this season; this is the third event in a row with a Porsche on top (fourth, if you disregard the Formula SAE car in event 2)!



utocross #6 will be Sunday, August 11, in the South Pits at Portland International Raceway (PIR). This means there are only three events left including AX 6. By now everyone should be in the full swing of things. New participants, now is the time to join in the fun, use the season to evaluate your strengths and weaknesses.

Most importantly, just come out have some driving fun and make some new friends.

This event is open to drivers of all skill levels, 16 years and older with a valid driver's license. For first time participants attending the ORPCA Autocross, instructors are available. For others the instructors are an invaluable asset for improving your time. Autocross is a great way to help you understand and feel what is taking place between you and your car as well as build new skills, gauge the limits of your car, or like was mentioned above have some driving fun and make new friends.

Autocross 6 registration opens at 7:30 a.m. Pre-registered participants must check in with registration for car number, work assignment, and run group. Drivers meeting will be at 8:30 a.m with first car out at 9:00 a.m. Again, instructors are recommended for first-time drivers. This event will count towards 2013 Championship points. Pre-registration for this event can be made online through www.MotorsportReg.com.

Entry fees are as follows: PCA members preregistered online: \$35.00; PCA members at the gate: \$45.00; Non-PCA members preregistered online: \$40.00; and Non-PCA members at the gate: \$50.00. ■

Important NEW Autocross Announcements

1. Effective with the 5/5/13 Autocross #3, the prices for walk-ups will increase to \$50 for non-members and \$45 for ORPCA members. This is to try and encourage participants to use the online preregistration at MotorsportReg.com, which will be staying the same price

(\$40 for non-members and \$35 for ORPCA members). Additionally, registration will be kept open until the Friday before each event at midnight. So, for example, the online registration is available for AX #3 until Friday 5/3 at midnight. Preregistration makes run groups, work assignments, and registration easier the day of the event for a smoother event and less volunteer workload.

2. All helmets must be Snell M2005, SA2005, M2010, or SA2010. DOT-only or older Snell helmets are not legal for OR-PCA Autocross, or PIR's property. Loaner helmets are available, but there are not many of them, and it's making it hard for all to participate. Legal helmets can be found online for under \$100 shipped.

chedule: The schedule is below, and is posted on the ORPCA website. You can also find more information for the ORPCA events and schedule them on a personalized calendar on Where2Race.com. We have updated the classes to match the current small region PCRs. Please review the ORPCA website to see where your car is now classed.

Registration: All registration for the ORPCA Autocross events will be done on www.MotorSportReg.org2

Registration for all events is open now. Registration for non- ORPCA members will be open two weeks prior to the event. Registration will be closed for all events at midnight the Wednesday prior to the event. All participants who preregister for an event will receive a copy of the course map via email before the event. There will be no refunds for any ORPCA Autocross events.

2013 Autocross Season Pass: The 2013 Season Pass will include all championship points events. Group Price: ORPCA Members: \$245; Non-ORPCA Members: \$280.

If you were to attend all of these events, the ORPCA member pre-registration fee would be \$280. We are offering a discount for the AX Season Pass. The total registration fee for the year is \$245, for a savings of \$35 (equivalent to one event).

For non-ORPCA participants, the preregistration fee is \$340 for all events. We are offering the same discount, bringing the total registration fee for the year to \$280, a savings of \$40 (or equivalent to one event). By purchasing the Season Pass, you are automatically signed up for all events, guaranteeing a slot and avoiding missing the registration window. You will also be emailed a copy of the course map after registration is closed on the Wednesday before an event. Registration for the 2013 Autocross Season Pass will be open until March 9 (before the start of the first event). Sorry, there are no refunds or credits for missed events.

2013 Championship Points: Participants must attend at least five of the eight events this season to be eligible for class trophies. Each participant is allowed to drop one event for the season. Trophies will be awarded based on class participation. We have a Non-Porsche Class. The Non-Porsche class is divided into two categories, Race Tire (NP-R) and Street Tire (NP-S). Race Tires are defined as any tires with tread ware ratings of 140 or below. We will count points and present trophies for both Non-Porsche classes. To be eligible for class points, participants must run at least five events in the same class and retain the same car number throughout the season, regardless of the car they campaign. Any and all Porsche cars (as defined by the PCA rules) will be ineligible for the Non-Porsche class (i.e. a Porsche with a non-Porsche engine is regarded as a Non-Porsche in the PCA rules).

2013 Reserved Car Numbers: The ORPCA database has been wiped clean for all participates who did not attend more that one event last season as well as all Non- Porsche entries. The remaining reserved car number will be distributed on a first come, first served basis. If you wish to reserve a number in the database for the 2013 season, please review the following:

- 1. Numbers below 100 will be reserved for ORPCA members. If you are a non-ORPCA member, your number will be over 100.
- 2. Numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served priority and you will retain that number the entire season. You will be notified if conflicts arise with your number selection.
- 3. Per our Autocross rules, each car/person combination you wish to enter needs a unique number. If you plan to share your car with another person, each person needs a unique number for the car. If you plan to run various cars throughout the season, please request a unique number for each combination.
- 4. When you request your number, please provide the driver's name, year, make and model of the car, and the ORPCA class you will be running. Remember, if you are not running a Porsche you will be automatically assigned to either the NP-R or NP-S (Non- Porsche) class.
- 5. Once your number is assigned, it will be yours for the entire Autocross season. Number reservations will close on March 1. Please e-mail AXRegistration@oregonpca.org with your requests.


Autocross Players Celebration Weekend




