Raceway History Where it's Least Expected

was recently introduced to a lady who is quite expert in old Rolls Royce and Bentley automobiles, and thus a great source of information for the occasions when I have to research one of those British classics. We were exchanging stories about our respective descent into gear-headedness during our adolescence. Real gear-heads get started early, almost always before we are legally old enough to take the wheel. Usually, that meant sneaking out at night when the folks were out in the other family car. How did we prevent our parents from tumbling to our little scheme? Why, by disconnecting the speedometer/odometer cable from behind the instrument panel, a very minor task, then returning the car to precisely the same spot where it had been parked, and reconnecting the cable. I figured it out when I was 13 or 14. The Rolls lady mentioned that she had done exactly that when she was only 12. How many of you plead guilty to the same youthful offense?

Sometimes, you trip over a delightful bit of history where you least expect it. My wife and I were kicking back on Kauai last February, when one afternoon, my eye was drawn to a ratty old Ford Fiesta in the parking lot of our condo complex. Since almost every other car in the lot was a late-model rental sedan or convertible, I harbored strong doubts that it belonged to one of the guests. Indeed, the owner turned out to be the overnight security guard. What caught my eye was a large decal in a side quarter window...

The decal immediately triggered memories of attending races at Ascot Park when I was a kid. My dad, who was a Scoutmaster, would haul the troop out to Gardena several times a year to watch crazy guys race their jalopies around the dirt half-mile oval. I spotted the security guard one evening and asked him where he had obtained the decal, and he told me that he had been one of J.C. Agajanian's employees. He told me that he was guarding the entrants' gate one night when some guy walked up, shoved a gun in his face, and demanded the gate receipts. 

n mid-February came word that Porsche Motorsport North America has purchased the venerable Southern



California Porsche race prep shop known as ANDIAL. The company was founded in 1975 by partners Arnold Wagner, Dieter Inzenhofer, and Alwin Springer, who was to become the head of PMNA. Springer, the last active partner, retired at the end of February, but PMNA appears determined to keep the shop going. Just a few days later, we learned that German Porsche specialist and independent manufacturer Alois Ruf had sold a stake in his company to Genii Capital, the investment firm that also owns the Lotus Formula One team. Genii principal Gerard Lopez has been a Ruf fan and friend of Alois for more than 20 years. Remember that wonderful new four-liter V8 that Ruf created to fit in the tail of a 911? Funding from Genii Capital may be what's needed to get that motor into limited production ... or could a version of this motor someday find its way into a Lotus race car? I also wonder if Porsche was offered a buy-in and turned it down.



D ack in the March issue, I discussed the problems connected to E15 gaso-

Dline, which contains 15% Ethanol, and has been shown to be extremely damaging to older vehicles. Now, we learn that two bills have introduced in Congress to block the mandatory nation-wide sale of E15. They are House Bill 875 and Senate Bill 344. Let's hope that by the time you read this, Congress will have come to its senses and kill the EPA's pro-E15 plan, which is nothing but a sop to midwest corn farmers.

Another feather in Zuffenhausen's cap ... The new 911 Carrera S (991) has been named Car of The Year by *The Robb Report*. It was featured on the cover of the magazine's March, 2013 issue.

Sadly, there are still charlatans amongst us, and the following report, gleaned from the *Los Angeles Times* last fall, suggests sellers need to be very cautious when placing a car on consignment. An Orange County businessman faced charges of embezzling the proceeds of the rare and vintage Porsches that he sold on consignment. The man was charged with 14 counts of embezzlement by fiduciary of trust, five counts of grand theft by false pretenses, two counts of diversion of funds and four counts of money laundering. The suspect allegedly sold the cars at prices ranging from \$25,000 to \$47,000, and then diverted the sale proceeds to his personal and business accounts.

Rounding out the trophies in 6th in a class of 32 was Hayward Tyler in an STi. Newcomer Jonathan Greenleaf wheeled his amazing Boss 302 to 2nd in Race Tire while son Zach co-drove.

S01 had Rod Street taking the victory in his 07 Boxster in what is becoming a rapidly expanding class. S02 featured another strong field with Jim Pileggi on top in his 05 Boxster S. Both of these classes are for 100% factory stock Porsches, right down to the spare tire and tool kit. Why don't you bring yours out for a little fun at our next event on June 23rd?

P01 had Cary Kutter and Harry Danberg dicing it up in the classics again, with Cary's 914 just a little faster. In P02 Eric "The Great Leader" Freedle once again dictated a victory over Jim Parks, both in classic 1986 Carreras. P03 had Jeff Gretz take the solo victory while his co-driver, Gary Chapman, used the coincidentally for sale (see the Anzeiger Classifieds) 01 Boxster into M01, also for the solo victory.

I01 had your author just nosing out the newly-minted Autocross Chair, Todd "Great Successor" Averitt, both

in his 914. Unfortunately, the Green Hornet suffered a light clutch disc failure. Fortunately, the failure was caught early and the remaining runs aborted so look for a Glorious Return come event #4! And finally in P04, Barry Cogut took the solo victory, and for the first time in his career, overall Fastest Time of the Day! This also marks the first Porsche FTD since Gary Chapman's 914-6 in July of last year! Way to go Barry!

Autocross 4 ... Halfway Through the Season

Sunday, June 23, Portland International Raceway

utocross #4 will be Sunday June 23 in the South Pits at Portland International Raceway (PIR). This marks the mid point in our Autocross season. This means there are only five events left including AX 4, so you are still in the hunt for Championship points and awards. By now everyone should be in the full swing of things. New participants, now is the time to join in the fun, use the season to evaluate your strengths and weaknesses. Most importantly, just come out have some driving fun and make some new friends.

This event is open to drivers of all skill levels, 16 years and older with a valid driver's license. For first time participants attending the ORPCA Autocross, instructors are available. For others the instructors are an invaluable asset for improving your time. Autocross is a great way to help you understand and feel what is taking place between you and your car as well as build new skills, gauge the limits of your car, or like was mentioned above have some driving fun and make new friends.

Autocross 4 registration opens at 7:30 a.m. Pre-registered participants must check in with registration for car number, work assignment, and run group. Drivers meeting will be at 8:30 a.m with first car out at 9:00 a.m. Again, instructors are recommended for first-time drivers. This event will count towards 2013 Championship points. Preregistration for this event can be made online through www.MotorsportReg.com. The last day to preregister for this event online will be Friday midnight, June 21, 2013.

Entry fees are as follows: PCA members preregistered online: \$35.00; PCA members at the gate: \$45.00; Non-PCA members preregistered online: \$40.00; and Non-PCA members at the gate: \$50.00.

Important NEW Autocross Announcements

1. Effective with the 5/5/13 Autocross #3, the prices for walk-ups will increase to \$50 for non-members and \$45 for ORPCA members. This is to try and encourage participants to use the online preregistration

at MotorsportReg.com, which will be staying the same price (\$40 for non-members and \$35 for ORPCA members). Additionally, registration will be kept open until the Friday before each event at midnight. So, for example, the online registration is available for AX #3 until Friday 5/3 at midnight. Preregistration makes run groups, work assignments, and registration easier the day of the event for a smoother event and less volunteer workload.

2. All helmets must be Snell M2005, SA2005, M2010, or SA2010. DOT-only or older Snell helmets are not legal for ORPCA Autocross, or PIR's property. Loaner helmets are available, but there are not many of them, and it's making it hard for all to participate. Legal helmets can be found online for under \$100 shipped.

chedule: The schedule is below, and is posted on the ORPCA website. You can also find more information for the OR-PCA events and schedule them on a personalized calendar on Where2Race.com. We have updated the classes to match the current small region PCRs. Please review the ORPCA website to see where your car is now classed.

Registration: All registration for the ORPCA Autocross events will be done on www.MotorSportReg.org2

Registration for all events is open now. Registration for non- ORPCA members will be open two weeks prior to the event. Registration will be closed for all events at midnight the Wednesday prior to the event. All participants who preregister for an event will receive a copy of the course map via email before the event. There will be no refunds for any ORPCA Autocross events.

2013 Autocross Season Pass: The 2013 Season Pass will include all championship points events. Group Price: ORPCA Members: \$245; Non-ORPCA Members: \$280.

If you were to attend all of these events, the ORPCA member pre-registration fee would be \$280. We are offering a discount for the AX Season Pass. The total registration fee for the year is \$245, for a savings of \$35 (equivalent to one event).

For non-ORPCA participants, the preregistration fee is \$340 for all events. We are offering the same discount, bringing the total registration fee for the year to \$280, a savings of \$40 (or equivalent to one event). By purchasing the Season Pass, you are automatically signed up for all events, guaranteeing a slot and avoiding missing the registration window. You will also be emailed a copy of the course map after registration is closed on the Wednesday before an event. Registration for the 2013 Autocross Season Pass will be open until March 9 (before the start of the first event). Sorry, there are no refunds or credits for missed events.

2013 Championship Points: Participants must attend at least five of the eight events this season to be eligible for class trophies. Each participant is allowed to drop one event for the season. Trophies will be awarded based on class participation. We have a Non-Porsche Class. The Non-Porsche class is divided into two categories, Race Tire (NP-R) and Street Tire (NP-S). Race Tires are defined as any tires with tread ware ratings of 140 or below. We will count points and present trophies for both Non-Porsche classes. To be eligible for class points, participants must run at least five events in the same class and retain the same car number throughout the season, regardless of the car they campaign. Any and all Porsche cars (as defined by the PCA rules) will be ineligible for the Non-Porsche class (i.e. a Porsche with a non-Porsche engine is regarded as a Non-Porsche in the PCA rules).

2013 Reserved Car Numbers: The ORPCA database has been wiped clean for all participates who did not attend more that one event last season as well as all Non- Porsche entries. The remaining reserved car number will be distributed on a first come, first served basis. If you wish to reserve a number in the database for the 2013 season, please review the following:

1. Numbers below 100 will be reserved for ORPCA members. If you are a non-ORPCA member, your number will be over 100.

2. Numbers will be assigned on a first come, first served priority and you will retain that number the entire season. You will be notified if conflicts arise with your number selection.

3. Per our Autocross rules, each car/person combination you wish to enter needs a unique number. If you plan to share your car with another person, each person needs a unique number for the car. If you plan to run various cars throughout the season, please request a unique number for each combination.

4. When you request your number, please provide the driver's name, year, make and model of the car, and the ORPCA class you will be running. Remember, if you are not running a Porsche you will be automatically assigned to either the NP-R or NP-S (Non- Porsche) class.

5. Once your number is assigned, it will be yours for the entire Autocross season. Number reservations will close on March 1. Please e-mail AXRegistration@oregonpca.org with your requests.

within easy walking distance to the hotels, and we'll meet up afterwards for a no-host gathering at Winthrop's best drinking hole.




