

Oregon PCA – Covid-19 Guidance – July 21, 2020

PCA Insurance:

We have been successful in getting insurance for our July events.

Phased Openings

Oregon Phases:

Currently Washington, Clackamas, and Multnomah Counties are in Phase 1. All other counties are in Phase 2. Washington, Clackamas and Multnomah have been linked together and cannot reach Phase 2 until they all are approved.

Portland International Raceway was approved for a restricted opening.

New orders are in place as of July 22 for all of Oregon:

1. Face coverings are required outdoors where social distancing of at least six feet can't be maintained (5 years old and above).
2. A ban on indoor social gatherings of more than ten people – no matter what phase the county is in.

Phase 1

- Restaurants and bars – Limited sit down serving with 6-foot distancing required
- In-person local gatherings – Individuals may gather locally for any purpose in groups of up to 25

Phase 2

- In-person gatherings – Individuals may gather for any purpose in groups of 50 people indoors and 100 people outdoors.
- Gatherings for Venues, Restaurants and Bars, Indoor and Outdoor Entertainment Facilities may be up to 250 people depending on the capacity of the venue.

Phase 3

Concerts, conventions, festivals, fairs and live audience sports will not be possible until a reliable treatment or prevention is available. Therefore, all large should be cancelled or significantly modified through at least September.

Washington Phases:

Two of our Washington counties, Clark and Cowlitz counties, are all in Phase 2. Phase 3 applications have been made but are pending. Skamania county is in Phase 3.

Phase 2 allows gatherings of 5 people outside your household per week.

Phase 3 allows gatherings of 50 people as well as non-essential travel.

What this means to Oregon PCA:

Autocross is opening as part of the PIR restricted openings.

Overall, if we are careful with the number of people in our events, we can have limited events.

Arrive and Drives, Mid-week Casual Drives, Tours. Options will depend on the phase of the county for the starting location and the finish plus:

- Attendees must register ahead of time and complete all required forms (Communicable Disease and Release and Waiver of Liability)
- There will be strict social distancing on meet-up, drivers meeting, rest-stops and the end of drive
- Face coverings are required outside of the car
- At the end of the drive, find a large outdoor area and do a bring your own "Picnic-style" gathering and bring your own chairs and food, with strict social distancing. Masks would be allowed to come off to eat.

Monthly Socials and Dinners, Quarterly Mixers, or other social events can be held subject to the limitations set by the phased opening guidelines in Oregon and Washington and the ORPCA Event Participation Guidelines. Options will depend on the location and the phase that location is in plus:

- Attendees must sign up ahead of time
- We find an appropriate location depending on the size of the group and location of the event
- We enforce strict social distancing
- We enforce wearing face coverings except when eating
