• When shooting, there should be a comfortable margin around all edges of the focal point (most often, a car). **Do NOT crop!** We will crop your photo to the best proportion for the page. *Photos with the edge of a car clipped off is the most common photo error.* 

### **COVER PHOTOS**

• The cover "bleeds" off the edges, so please leave a good margin on every side of the focal point (most often, a car)

• Make sure there is nothing significant in the masthead area.

#### **ALL PHOTOS**

• Shoot and send the highest resolution possible.

The biggest highlight of the afternooi was our parade lap on the road course. What a thrill to line up with 50 other Porsches and then check out the race track where the cars we were watching would race.

Saturday brought qualifying and racing with the two classes,

but the best was Saturday Night at the Movies. About 5:30 pm sling back chairs were brought out into the courtyard behind the Pagoda. There is a large screen on the tower on which they show the racing on the track. There was free popcorn, wine and beer and other snacks. Then we were treated to the movie, Top Gun: Maverick. It was awesome. The movie grabs you right from the beginning and never lets up. If you have not seen it, you need to! At the end of the movie, we were offered the sling back chairs to take with us. They did not want them back, so we took two home!

Sunday was more racing fun with grid walks for both sets of cars and watching a parade lap of the GT cars that people brought for the weekend. I counted 104! Then we spent time admiring and checking out

Just 11 miles later we were at Hannah Bridge. It was built in 1936 and spans Thomas Creek. It was easy to surmise this was a WPA project from the New Deal era. Like most of the bridges this day, its sides were open. Unlike the Midwestern and East Coast bridges, light flowed through the massive beams and steel supporting rods. This illumination made for excellent stop action pictures of Jim Goetsch in his Targa leading us across the historic wooden decking.

Next we came to Larwood Covered Bridge. This came after a short stop at the Roaring River Fish Hatchery. By the luck of the fortunate, 10 Porsches filled all 10 parking spots front and center. Ferdinand would be proud and we were struck by our good fortune and timing this ideal Saturday. This bridge was built the same year as Hannah but spans Crabtree Creek. Same year and same design made for a carbon copy visually as we rolled across.

Less than 10 miles on we came to Hoffman Covered Bridge. This was built 3 years later but also kept us dry over Crabtree Creek. While similar in design, its sides were less open. This created a cooler darkened traverse with an enticing sunny straightaway at hand after exiting. This beauty was built in 1939 and also crosses Thomas Creek. Twice in the last 30 years the bridge sustained substantial damages due to human folly. In 1997 an overloaded vehicle damaged the structure enough that it was closed for a year. Nine years later, 34 of the bridge was damaged when an inadvertent yet destructive hydraulic boom reduced the capacity 50%. The boom truck was stuck for five hours and the sheepish driver was trapped staring at his handy work. Today we rolled across with Stuttgart's precision engineering and superior production supporting our passion.

A final dash to the Oregon Garden resort and it was time for a few delectable potables; a Hefe here, an IPA there with a few more daring beverages making appearances. This was another memorable Saturday with the ORPCA. This drive is worth doing on your own if you're able. The first bridge and Pioneer Park were particularly fetching.
